PROS AND CONS OF ENDING THE ST. LOUIS CITY AND ST. LOUIS COUNTY DIVIDE

Leading journalists along with community and academic leaders share insights and perspectives at St. Louis Press Club and Greater St. Louis Association of Black Journalists

NEARLY 100 PARTICIPANTS gathered at the Central St. Louis City Library for a forum exploring the history and future of our St. Louis region's governmental structure. Hosted by the St. Louis City Library, it was held on Aug. 13 in their auditorium. Journalists and panelists explored how we got to where we are today and what possibilities there are for change.





THE FIRST SEGMENT focused on what caused this divide, what works and doesn't work for the region and is this good government? Journalists Venton Blandin, KMOV News 4 Reporter, and Jo Mannies, retired St. Louis Public Radio and St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter interviewed panelists Virvus Jones, former St. Louis City Comptroller; Pat Kelly, Executive Director of the Municipal League of Metropolitan St. Louis, and Dr. Todd Swanstrom, Des Lee Endowed Professor, UMSL.

THE SECOND HALF of the program focused on what is the future. If change, what would it look like? What are the pros and cons of remaining divided? Journalists
 Sharon Stevens, HEC-TV producer/reporter and former KSDK education reporter, and Dale Singer, retired St.

 Louis Public Radio reporter, interviewed panelists
 Shelley Welsch, former University City Mayor; Mike
 Jones, former policy aide to former Mayor Clarence

 Harmon and former County Executive Charlie Dooley, and Lewis Reed, St. Louis City President of the Board of Aldermen. Audience members had opportunities to submit questions to the panelists.


ST. LOUIS COUNTY LIBRARY AUTHOR TALKS:

"Sand and Steel: The D-Day Invasion and the Liberation of France"

7 p.m. Wednesday, Nov. 13

Published to commemorate the 75th anniversary of D-Day, British military historian Peter Caddick-Adams' "Sand and Steel" is a comprehensive, monumental account of the greatest and most consequential military operation of modern times, drawing on first-hand battlefield research, personal testimony and interviews. In addition to covering the build-up to the invasion, Caddick-Adams gives a detailed account of the German preparations and reveals precisely what lay in wait for the Allies. The heart of the book is Caddick-Adams' narratives of the five beaches, where the terrible drama played out — Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno, and Sword — and the attempt by American, British and Canadian soldiers to gain a foothold in Europe.




